ARRIVAL BY CAR

Through Austria towards Vienna (highway A1) and Bratislava (highways A4 and A6). Please note: In Slovakia the use of lights is compulsory, on motorways a vignette is required (speed limits: 50 km/h in town, 90 km/h out of town, 130 km/h on highways)

ARRIVAL BY TRAIN

Slovakia has a good rail network. There are regular trains from Vienna Main Station to Bratislava Central Station and Bratislava - Petržalka.

ARRIVAL BY BUS

Bratislava has a direct bus connection with several German, Austrian and Swiss cities.

ARRIVAL BY PLANE

Arrival is possible via the nearby airport in Vienna-Schwechat. From there, public transport will take you to Bratislava in one hour.

Bratislava: Colorful metropolis with a historic city center



Bratislava (formerly Pressburg) is the only capital city in the world that borders three sovereign states - Slovakia, Austria and Hungary. In addition to its strategic location on the Danube, the city boasts a rich history. The first Celtic fortified settlement originated here in the 2nd century BC. In the area of the city met two historical trade routes, the Danube and Amber Roads, which significantly influenced the development of trade and craft. Bratislava was capital for 247 years (1536-1783) and 267 years coronation town (1563-1830) of the Hungarian Kingdom. Bratislava Castle became the representative royal seat. Not only the castle, but also the newly built aristocratic palaces in the Baroque and Rococo style were pleased in this time about the lively political, social and cultural life, which was enriched through the visits of important musicians such as Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart, Ludwig van Beethoven, Joseph Haydn or Franz Liszt. After the fall of the Iron Curtain in 1989, Bratislava began to make a name for itself as a modern European metropolis and attractive tourist destination. The unique history and attractive sights, the rich cultural life, the excellent local gastronomy, quality wines and modern shopping centers make Bratislava an ideal destination for a city break.

Below you find a small selection of attractions

Old Town Hall (main square)



Original seat of the city administration, from the year 1868 on the seat of the museum of the city of Bratislava, the oldest museum in Slovakia. After conquering the narrow staircase, which leads to its 45-meter-high tower, a magnificent panoramic view of the old town is offered.

Michael's Gate



The only still remaining gate of the fortification from the 14th century. From the upper terrace of its 51-meter-high tower you can enjoy the view of the Bratislava Castle and the Old Town. The tower houses the weapons museum.

Rubberneck (Čumil)



The bronze male figure, peeking out of a manhole, is undoubtedly the most photographed sculpture in the city.

St. Martin Cathedral



Gothic church, consisting of three naves, 15th century, former coronation church. A reminder of this glorious time is the gilded replica of the coronation crown, which is placed at the top of the tower of the cathedral, at the height of 85 meters and weighing 150 kilograms.

Bratislava Castle



Originally the seat of the rulers, today a symbol of Bratislava and the seat of the Historical Museum. The 47-meter-high tower, where once the royal coronation insignia were kept, offers a magnificent view not only of the city, but also on the neighboring countries.

UFO (Nový most)



Unique observation deck on the piers of the Most SNP bridge at a height of 95 meters with a view of the city and a visibility up to 100 kilometers. It offers the most beautiful sunset in Bratislava in combination with a culinary experience.

City Park (Horský Park)



The Horský Park is a 22-hectare city park in the district Staré Mesto. Despite the geographical proximity to the center of the city, the park still has much of its original flora and fauna and is a green attraction for nature lovers to go jogging, hiking and relaxing.
